God Reveals Himself to Us Through His Son

Keep these ideas in mind as you study *Chapter 1*.

❖ God reveals himself through the Trinity. We will come to know God in many ways, but especially through Jesus.

❖ God calls us friends. He reveals himself because he loves us. God wants us to know him better so that we will love him more.

❖ All the things God has created tell us something about him.

PAGE 4

❖ God reveals himself perfectly through Jesus. The Incarnation is when the Son of God became man.

❖ God reveals himself in the words he speaks to us and in the deeds he does for us.

❖ God became man so that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life.

PAGE 5

❖ Jesus visited the apostles after he rose from the dead. Thomas was not with them. When the apostles told him, Thomas did not believe. He wanted to see Jesus for himself.

❖ God gave us a share in his own life and the gift of faith when we were baptized. Faith is a precious gift that helps us believe in him.

❖ We strengthen our faith by doing what God tells us, celebrating the sacraments, listening to God's Word, and studying the Church's teachings.

❖ We haven't actually seen God, but we believe in him because we have faith. We receive the gift of faith when we are baptized.

God Speaks to Us in Scripture

Keep these ideas in mind as you study *Chapter 2*.

❖ We refer to the Bible as Sacred Scripture, which means “holy writing.” It was written hundreds of years ago by many different people. Sacred Scripture is made up of many books.

❖ The Church teaches us that God inspired, or worked within the minds of, the Scripture writers. That is why we believe the Bible is the Word of God.

❖ The Bible is separated into two parts. The Old Testament is about what God did before Jesus came, and the New Testament is about the life of Jesus and the early church. Both sections tell us about God’s message of love.

❖ The Old Testament tells how God revealed himself to the Hebrews, led them out of Egypt, gave them his laws of love, and made them his own people.

PAGE 10

❖ Parts of the Old Testament tell how God wanted his people to live. He gave these messages through the prophets, who were sent by God to teach people.

❖ God shows his people how to pray in the Book of Psalms. The psalms are prayers of praise, thanksgiving, petition, and sorrow. We say or sing them.

❖ There are four Gospels. They are the Gospels according to Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The Gospel is the “Good News” of Jesus, our Savior.

❖ The last book of the New Testament is called the Book of Revelation. It tells about a prophet named John, who talks about the glories of God’s kingdom.

God Speaks to Us Through the Church

❖ The Church is the people of God. The baptized members who believe in Jesus and follow the leadership of the pope and the bishops are called Catholics.

❖ God speaks to us through the Church, and he sent the Holy Spirit to be with it and to guide it. He calls us to work together to spread the Good News.

❖ The pope and the bishops teach and govern the Church. They are shepherds who care for God's people and lead them to a holy way of life.

❖ All of God's people can love and serve God. Our parents and teachers show children what it means to be a Christian by teaching them to be like Jesus.

❖ Caring for God's creation is serving God. Visiting an elderly person, collecting canned goods for those who are needy, and planting greenery are just a few ways to serve God's kingdom.

❖ By loving each other, married men and women show us how Jesus loves the Church. Others show love through their lives as religious. Single people also serve the Church.

❖ Jesus is the head of the Church, and he chose Peter to be the visible head. Peter would teach and lead the Church in the name of Jesus.

❖ When the Holy Father, the pope, speaks as the head of the Church, Jesus speaks through him. The Holy Spirit guides the pope and other bishops who teach and lead.

❖ After the apostles finished fishing, Jesus asked Peter if he loved him. Peter replied that he did, and Jesus asked him to feed and tend to his sheep.

❖ God led his people out of slavery in Egypt, with Moses as their guide.

❖ God came down in fire, and Mount Sinai was wrapped in smoke. God called Moses to the top of the mountain and gave him the Ten Commandments.

❖ God's best gift to us is Jesus. He shows us how to love God our Father above everything else. He shows us how to love God by praying and by taking care of others.

We Love All That Is Holy

❖ The Second Commandment says that you shall not take the name of the Lord in vain.

❖ In court, people are sometimes asked to swear. In this case, swearing means calling on God to witness that what they say is true.

PAGE 69

❖ We should only use God's name with love and respect. Cursing is using God's name to wish harm to someone or something.

PAGE 69

❖ Jesus taught us to pray "Hallowed be thy name." We honor God's name as "hallowed," or holy, when we use it with love and respect.

❖ We give our love to God when we keep the Second Commandment. God's name is holy because God is holy. Jesus taught us to call God our Father.

❖ When we sing and pray, we can use the many names of God, such as *Lord* and *Father*. Each name that we call God tells how good he is.

❖ The name of Jesus is so holy and powerful that repeating the name is itself one of the oldest and best prayers. People come to feel his love and presence.

❖ Jesus wanted people to respect the Temple as a holy place. When he saw that people were not honoring that holy place, he knocked over their tables and told them to leave. Today he wants us to respect all holy people, places, and things.

❖ Holy people, places, and things help us think of God. When we honor what is holy, we praise and honor God.

❖ Certain places are called holy because they are special places where we pray and worship. Our homes are holy because we pray together there as a family.

We Keep the Lord's Day Holy

❖ When God created the world, he worked for six days and rested on the seventh.

❖ The Third Commandment says to remember to keep holy the Lord's Day. God rested on the seventh day. He told his people to do as he had done. God's people were careful to keep that day holy.

❖ The early Christians kept Sunday as the Lord's Day because Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Sunday. They came together to celebrate the Eucharist.

❖ Precepts of the Church are certain laws of the Church. One of these laws requires Catholics to go to Mass on specific holy days.

❖ We celebrate Sunday with the Eucharist because God tells us to keep that day holy. Prayer and fun are good for us, and celebrating the Lord's Day builds up the community.

❖ The Eucharist is our greatest prayer. As we celebrate the Eucharist, we pray prayers of praise, thanks, sorrow, and petition. "Give us this day our daily bread" is a prayer of petition.

❖ Long ago in England and Wales, it was a crime to be Catholic. Saint Margaret Clitherow hid priests in her house, where they would celebrate Mass in secret.

❖ Jesus showed his love for Mary and Joseph through his obedience. Jesus respected and obeyed them, although he was greater than they were because he was God's son.

❖ God asks our parents to love and care for us. They are to give us what we need to grow as God's children. Families are different in many ways, but all families should have members who love and care for each other.

❖ We honor our parents by loving, respecting, helping, and obeying them. We also pray for our parents.

❖ We also keep the Fourth Commandment when we respect and obey those in authority, such as our teachers or crossing guards. Jesus wants us to respect and obey leaders in our country and our Church. The Holy Spirit helps us honor and obey those in authority.

❖ God wants us to be healthy, happy people and to love ourselves. If we do, then we can enrich the world by helping others and giving glory to God. Eating healthful foods, exercising, and listening to our parents are ways we can take care of ourselves.

❖ There are other ways of breaking the Fifth Commandment besides killing. Teasing, fighting, risk taking, and being prejudiced also harm life.

❖ Peter Claver was a Spanish priest who helped African slaves who arrived in the West Indies. Father Claver saw how cruel slavery was when he met the slave ships. The slaves were starving, sick, and dying. He gave them fresh fruit and medicine. He baptized more than 40 thousand people.

❖ A lawyer asked Jesus what he had to do in order to win eternal life. Jesus told him the story of the Good Samaritan, who treated a wounded man with mercy. In the story, a man was hurt and left to die on the side of the road. A religious man and another traveler passed him by. Then a man from Samaria came along and treated him with kindness.

❖ Everyone has the right to own things. God wants us to respect other people's rights. This means that we should respect what belongs to others.

❖ We should be careful not to damage, ruin, or lose what belongs to others. If we do, we must repair it or pay for it.

❖ God gave us free will, which allows us to choose to do right or wrong.

❖ The decision to do right or wrong is called a moral choice. The Holy Spirit will help us make good decisions.

❖ Dorothy Day helped create a newspaper called the *Catholic Worker*. This newspaper told what life was like for people who were poor. Dorothy Day believed that it wasn't enough just to give money to people in need. You should take them in and treat them as you would treat Jesus.
