

Discuss with your child the many ways we show others signs of our love and caring. Then, together, make a chart for your child to track

#### **Bringing Our Children to Jesus**

One of the most touching scenes in the New Testament is in the Gospel of Mark when Jesus shows his love for and devotion to children. During this event, people were bringing their children to Jesus for his blessing, but his disciples tried to send them away. Jesus was upset by the actions of his disciples and insisted that they bring the children to him. Jesus then embraced and blessed the children. As parents, we have a daily opportunity to help our children discover who Jesus is for them. In what ways do we act as the disciples did, keeping our children away from Jesus? In what ways are we bringing Jesus and our children together?

#### **Dinnertime Conversation Starter**

**L**ncourage your child to bring friends into your home and discuss with him or her ways to make friends feel welcome and special.



## Spirituality in Action

Talk with your child about people who are homeless and ways we can show them signs of caring. Help can be given in a variety of ways, whether it be through a donation of



time, supplies, or money. A simple way to get involved is by making care packages of common items and delivering them to shelters. Toothbrushes, toothpaste, soap,

hairbrushes, socks, and towels are always useful. As you make up these packages together, discuss with your child the importance of helping others.
