Read these summaries to review important terms and the main idea of each article in Unit 4.

### SESSION 16: JESUS GIVES US HIMSELF *(pages 120–126)*

ARTICLE 1	<b>A New Passover</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Institution Narrative, Last Supper, transubstantiation
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Eucharist is the heart of the life of the Church. With the grace we receive in the Eucharist, we serve others in Jesus' name.

ARTICLE 2	<b>Jesus and the Eucharist</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> real presence, liturgy, Mystical Body of Christ
	<b>REMEMBER</b> In the Eucharist we recognize the real presence of Jesus Christ at the consecration. We go forth from the Eucharist to continue God's work in the world.

### SESSION 17: JESUS MAKES A CHOICE *(pages 127–133)*

ARTICLE 1	<b>Jesus' Night of Sorrow</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Agony in the Garden, social sin
	<b>REMEMBER</b> In his Agony in the Garden, Jesus was tempted to avoid his suffering and Death, but he remained faithful to his Father. We are also called to remain true to our identity as sons and daughters of God, especially when we are tempted to run away from God.

ARTICLE 2	<b>Making Moral Choices</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> moral choice, conscience
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The morality of an act has three dimensions—the act chosen, the intention behind the act, and the circumstances behind the act. We develop a fully formed conscience through the guidance of parents and teachers, prayer, Scripture, Church teachings, and learning from our mistakes.

SESSION 18: **JESUS REDEEMS US** (pages 134–140)

ARTICLE 1	<b>The Suffering Servant</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Paschal Mystery, Transfiguration, Passion
	<b>REMEMBER</b> We are called to reflect on, understand, and articulate who Jesus is and to live in a way that shows we know, understand, and follow him.

ARTICLE 2	<b>The Moment of Truth</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Apostles' Creed
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Jesus' Passion and Death help us understand the meaning of the Cross and our response as his disciples in the world.

SESSION 19: **JESUS BRINGS US NEW LIFE** (pages 141–147)

ARTICLE 1	<b>An Empty Tomb</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> social justice, marginalized
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Holy Spirit assists us to find the presence of God in all things. We find the risen Christ among the suffering. Christ is present with us in prayer, in the Christian community, and in the sacraments.

ARTICLE 2	<b>Sacraments of Initiation</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> doxology
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. They mark our entry into the community of the Church, which was born as a result of the Resurrection.

SESSION 20: **CELEBRATING HOLY WEEK AND EASTER** (pages 148–154)

ARTICLE 1	<b>Journey Through Holy Week</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> <i>Exsultet</i>
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The liturgies and rites of Holy Week help us enter into the sacred mysteries at the heart of our faith—Jesus' life, Death, and Resurrection, which have won our Salvation.

ARTICLE 2	<b>Promise of the Resurrection</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> indulgence, particular judgment, Purgatory
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Jesus' Resurrection opens the promise of eternal life with him in heaven. After death we will be judged by a loving and merciful God who will determine how we will spend eternity.
