

## Jesus Lives On

Read these summaries to review important terms and the main idea of each article in Unit 5.

### SESSION 21: JESUS OPENS OUR EYES *(pages 159–165)*

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>Recognizing Jesus in Our Lives</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> the Way
	<b>REMEMBER</b> We can be uncertain about our mission in life when we fail to recognize Jesus' presence. We encounter and recognize Jesus in the Eucharist. Jesus' life follows a path through life, Death, into Resurrection, and finally Ascension to Heaven. Following Jesus means that this is our path, too, as we live with the hope of being reunited with God.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>Coworkers with God</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> dignity of work, consumerism, Epistle
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Work gives people a sense of dignity and accomplishment. The work we do contributes to society and expresses our vocation to be cocreators with God. God creates us for a purpose. We discover our mission over time and with many experiences.

### SESSION 22: JESUS SENDS US FORTH WITH HIS SPIRIT *(pages 166–172)*

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>The Gift of Pentecost</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Good News, Gifts of the Holy Spirit
	<b>REMEMBER</b> At Pentecost the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples, giving them the strength to embrace their mission to spread the Good News. The seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>The Seal of Confirmation</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Chrism
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Confirmation ties us more closely to the Body of Christ. Confirmation helps us be witnesses to the Christian faith in the things we say and do.

SESSION 23: **WE ARE CALLED AND SENT** (pages 173–179)

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>Saint Paul Sees the Light</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> poverty, chastity, obedience, justification, righteousness
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Paul became the greatest missionary of the early Church. God also calls us to conversion. He has provided a way for us to repair and reconcile our relationship with him and invites us to live the Kingdom of God.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>Letters of Saint Paul</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Matrimony, Holy Orders, deacon
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Paul’s Epistles to early Christian communities provided guidance on topics that still apply today. The Sacrament of Matrimony is a sign of the union between Christ and his Church. Men who receive Holy Orders continue the mission entrusted by Christ to his Apostles.

SESSION 24: **JESUS CALLS US TO ETERNAL LIFE** (pages 180–186)

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>The Struggle Between Good and Evil</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> apocalyptic literature, literary form
	<b>REMEMBER</b> To understand the Book of Revelation, we recognize that its literary form relies on symbols and images. It is not intended to be interpreted literally. In the Book of Revelation, God claims eternal victory over the forces of evil.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>Assumption of the Blessed Mother</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Last Judgment, Assumption, infallible, Communion of Saints
	<b>REMEMBER</b> Through Mary we know that those who serve God can look forward to eternal life with him. Mary holds an exalted place in the Communion of Saints.

SESSION 25: **CELEBRATING PENTECOST** (pages 187–193)

<b>ARTICLE 1</b>	<b>The Holy Spirit Guides the Church</b>
	<b>DEFINE</b> Paraclete
	<b>REMEMBER</b> God fulfilled Jesus’ promise to the Apostles by sending the Holy Spirit. They were filled with the faith and courage needed to spread his Word. Today we celebrate the strength given to us by the Holy Spirit when we live faithfully as Jesus’ followers.

<b>ARTICLE 2</b>	<b>The Holy Spirit Makes Us Holy</b>
	<b>REMEMBER</b> The Holy Spirit is present in our prayers. We serve the Kingdom of God and grow in holiness when we use gifts received from the Holy Spirit.
