

# Focus on Faith

### Faith, Hope, and Charity

Blessed Jeanne Jugan (1792–1879) was born into a poor family in Brittany, France. In a local hospital she learned how to help those who were even poorer than she. Jeanne begged in order to help those who needed care. One businessman complained that she continued to bother him after he had given her money. Jeanne told him that the poor people she helped were hungry yesterday, are hungry today, would be hungry tomorrow, and that she would continue to beg for them. The businessman relented and became a regular contributor. Jeanne's community, the Little Sisters of the Poor, continues her work today. Its members are an example of how the decisions of a single person can lead to helping others globally.
