Jesus Asks Us to Dream

As parents, we do our best to take care of our children's basic needs. In the story of Jesus and the rich young man, we see that the young man has taken care of the basic needs in his life. He follows the Commandments and Jesus loves him. Then Jesus asks the young man to dream, to go beyond the basics, but the man walks away. Jesus is also asking us to dream. How can we as parents use our imaginations to discover ways to love our children that call us beyond giving them the basic things they need?

Dinnertime Conversation Starter

Talk about what you think it would be like to follow Jesus. How did he travel? What did he eat? Where did he sleep? What do you think life was like for a follower of Jesus? Would you like to travel with him, or would that be scary?

If you are not a regular contributor, you might talk with your child about a charity you could choose to help as a family. Talk with your child about the importance of giving up things we want in order to help those who do not have what they need.
