Help your family remember the importance of faith, hope, and charity by displaying these virtues in a family art project. One night this week, have each person

A Saint for Our Time

Thérèse of Lisieux (1873–1897) was the youngest of nine children in a devout Catholic family. She received permission to enter the Carmelite community in 1888. Thérèse wanted to die as a missionary. She discovered instead that God had called her to make small sacrifices each day and to live in constant awareness of his presence. Her older sister Pauline, her superior in the community, recognized that Thérèse had special gifts from God and directed her to write her autobiography, *The Story of a Soul*.

After years of physical and spiritual suffering, Thérèse died from tuberculosis
